The Women of Fort Defiance: A Five Part Series

The following article is Part Four of the continuing series on the women of Fort Defiance. This issue will focus on Eliza Mira Lenoir daughter of William Lenoir and Ann Ballard Lenoir.

Eliza Mira Lenoir was born on September 20, 1789, in Wilkes County and lived at Fort Defiance until her death on August 16, 1835, having never married.

Not much is known about Mira except through newspaper clippings and letters of the family. A newspaper article published in *The Morganton Herald* dated August 14, 1890 is about the Hon. Robert H. Burton, however, there is a small notation of Mira included. "It was said, that at one time the Hon. Robert H. Burton who settled and practiced law in Morganton was engaged to Miss Myra (Mira) Lenoir, a daughter of General Lenoir, who never married. On account of some disagreement, she broke off the engagement."

In the book entitled *Echoes of Happy Valley,* by Thomas Felix Hickerson a letter from Mira dated July 9, 1828 to her niece Julia of whom she was also guardian gives the reader a glimpse of what life was like for Mira at that point in time.

Dearest Julia: I expect others have told you about your Cousin Eliza's wedding, etc. We had a pleasant time and should have been truly glad if you and Louisa could have been here. Mira D - went with the party to Spartanburg. I have been sorry ever since that I did not go too, for they appeared anxious to have me. There was a great ball in Spartanburg on the 4th of July, partly in compliment to Mr. and Mrs. Henry. We all had tickets there, and to a ball in Wilkesboro, but did not go.

We received a letter last week from your Uncle Samuel. He is not coming to North Carolina this summer. Says your dear little brothers [he, being their guardian] are well and doing well. I don't know whether you have heard that the Legislature of Alabama unanimously entered into a resolution to have a vessel fitted out to send to the Island of Cuba for the purpose of conveying the remains of your dear Father to his plantation home in Alabama to be buried by the side of his beloved wife. [Governor Pickens had gone to Cuba hoping the climate would improve his health]. It is an evidence of the high regard in which that State held him, and a testimony of their respect to his memory, that I shall ever feel grateful for, tho it was nothing more than he deserved....

I tried to get a homespun dress to send you by Edmund but could not get it woven. Let me know how you like Louisa's, and if you had rather have yours some other stripe, and whether you want it checked, and all about it. Let me know what you need and how you get your clothes made.

Mother gets a little better of her lameness and her health is tolerably good, and father is quite well. They both send their love to you and L-, and you must be good girls. I hope there is no danger of your doing otherwise. I cannot think that either of you will ever act so as willfully to cause moments of disquietude to your friends...... You and L-know that I love you and wish you every good. Heaven bless and preserve you and fill your hearts with gratitude for all its blessing.

With sincere affection, Your aunt Mira

As stated earlier, Mira died on August 16, 1935, and is buried in the family cemetery at Fort Defiance which is still being used by the Lenoir family.



The inscription on the tombstone states,

Eliza Mira Lenoir

Born September 20, 1789

Died August 16, 1835

Daughter of William and Ann Lenoir

"Admired and beloved for her intellectual and moral worth and will long be affectionately remembered by her relations and numerous friends." Heaven is our best home.

An obituary for Mira published in the *Weekly Raleigh Register*, Tuesday, September 15, 1835 states "At Fort Defiance, Wilkes County, on the 15th of August, after a lingering illness, Miss Eliza Mira Lenoir, daughter of General William Lenoir, in the 45th year of her age. The deceased possessed in an eminent degree all the moral, social and refined qualities of the heart, which adorn and beautify the female character, in the exemplification of which, the many acts of kindness and urbanity which it fell to her lot to dispense at the hospitable mansion of her venerable father, bears ample testimony, and will be long remembered by an extensive circle of friends and acquaintances."

Art Project Update

The Board of Directors at Fort Defiance is excited about the unique opportunity to honor the enslaved individuals and families who labored at the plantation, but whose lives and contributions have long been overlooked. A fund raising campaign began to raise funds to commission a painting that will shed light on their stories and experiences.

The artist chosen for this project is Israel Solomon, a descendant of Nancy (born 1785), Fairby (born 1806), and Edmund (born 1835 and sold 1848), who were among those enslaved at Fort Defiance. Israel is a talented painter, muralist, and educator based in Indianapolis, Indiana, known for his vibrant and colorful paintings depicting people and community scenes.

The commissioned painting will cover an entire wall in the summer kitchen building, which houses a new exhibit about the enslaved people who lived and worked on the plantation. The painting will provide visitors with deep and lasting interpretations that present the reality of slavery to a modern generation



The following was taken from among the old letters and papers which were examined by William Lenoir's grand-daughter, Laura Lenoir Norwood.

Written by William Lenoir—7th October, 1780. "We defeated Ferguson and his army at Kings Mountain. Killed and took all. Their total number was 1187, their dead 250. Our number was about 700. Our dead 32 and 40 died afterword of their wounds
